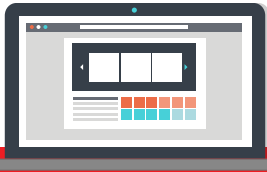
Actual PowerSchool Enrollment

Did You Know



- Lexington One remains one of the fastest-growing school districts in the state, ranking sixth in total enrollment.
- Lexington One is projecting 635 new students in 2018–2019
- Even after building 15 new schools since 1997, the district still uses 150 portables across the district.
- World language is offered at all levels including elementary, middle and high schools.

Students

- Lexington One's on-time graduation rate for 2017 was 90.2 percent.
- Lexington One's 2017 high school graduates earned \$114 million in scholarships.
- Our students excel in state and national award-winning marching bands, symphonic bands, choral programs, strings programs and athletic programs.
- Lexington One students perform well on nationally normed assessments (ACT, PSAT, SAT, MAP).

Staff

- The district currently has 3,805 employees, not including substitutes (219 administrators, 2,092 certified employees, 1,302 support staff and 192 bus drivers).
- 70 percent of our teachers have master's degrees or above.
- Student-to-teacher ratios (core subject areas) in 5-Year-Old Kindergarten through Grade 5 is 22.2 to 1, Grade 6 through Grade 8 is 22.9 to 1, and Grade 9 through Grade 12 is 24.5 to 1.
