Q9 Why are you running for a seat on the Board of Trustees?

I am running to provide a fresh approach to financial and educational responsibility on the Lexington One School Board. Q12 What is the single most important issue facing public education today?

When standardized testing was implemented, I believe the intent was to ensure that all children had access to a quality education. Measurements were intended to ensure that occurred. As with many issues, this has now taken on a different role than intended. While being a School Board member does not allow us to change the laws, we do need to determine how to effectively manage this issue. In my view, quality education is not directly proportional to standardized testing, however I realize funding usually is. Lexington One will need to determine how to get ALL of our students ready to be positive contributors to society, while also getting the testing scores necessary for sufficient funding. I don't believe these issues are directly correlated and decisions about our district shouldn't be managed in that way.
